

Pastor Report

It seems incredible to me that I have walked along with you for a whole year. I'm amazed at how God has been busy working in the life of this church and each person that calls this place home.

I have spent considerable time this year observing and learning in order to get acquainted with every one and learn how the pieces of fabric that gives this church its unique personality is sewn together to create the beautiful quilt of God's love; all in preparation of the next step. His love definitely shines here. What a rewarding and amazing journey it has been.

I was able to make a few home visits; most recently I went along with the deacons as they did their annual gift delivery/carol singing. As your "Out-of-town" pastor, it was exciting to see some of the area and visit people in their homes. It was also my pleasure to make a few hospital visits, as needed. I shared Thanksgiving dinner with one of our families and lunch with folks at Good Golly's and at a home between services. I feel so blessed by this church family and for your love and grace when I goof and forget things. Even though I strive for things to run smoothly and without mishaps, I am human and you have allowed me to be me.

We have been blessed by three people that have been attending regularly and others that come occasionally to worship with us. We miss others that find it hard to attend worship, due to work schedules, etc. And, as winter is upon us, we genuinely miss our Snowbirds; while waiting anxiously for their return in the spring.

I will continue to work with the Ecumenical group as long as it feels like the right path to take. I was a little concerned about the possible lack of interest in the Service of Remembrance but we had a very good attendance from our members. The offering taken amounted to \$320; \$160 went to the Oswego County Suicide prevention endeavor and the other \$160 went to Oswego County Hospice. The picnic on the North shore last summer went well and I think it is worth considering to do again in 2020. The 9/11 observance service was inspiring and accomplished the goals we set. I was very thankful for the support at my first attempt at doing something a little different for Maundy Thursday and it was a thrill that so many from the community churches were able to join us for that. (A special thank you to Rebekah and Cherie and anyone else that helped with the Easter breakfast.) From that service the Community Choir took off and is going well. We will be meeting in January to start thinking and planning on how to work together for Lent and Easter observances. It has also been suggested that we might have a Vacation Bible School next summer. I have spoken to Rev. Abbott from the Universalist Church and she is onboard for her church to be involved with VBS with us. I feel it is important for us to share the story of Jesus with the children in our immediate vicinity. We may never see those children here on Sunday morning but it is our responsibility to plant the seed and let God do His work in their lives.

Our First Annual Picnic in the Parking Lot was a great success and I'm looking forward to the Second Annual Picnic.

By the time you read this, I hope to have an Adopted Missionary for us to focus on. Offering prayers for them and the work they are doing. I also hope to have developed a monthly mission focus going forward. Focusing on local community, denominational offerings and outreach opportunities may seem like a lot of asking from folks already on limited incomes but I want to emphasize that you are not required to give to everything (or anything) we present. Only give where your heart leads you. Some of us are more concerned with the less fortunate in this community, others feel we need to reach the hurting and sick in hospitals or nursing homes, while others hurt for the poor around our world and the work of our missionaries. Until I meet again with the mission team, I don't know what we will be presenting but I'm sure it will happen. I do believe that if we know ahead of time what is to happen we can be prepared to give whatever we can.

There is planning for a choir to sing a weekly anthem during Sunday worship. And plans are forming for Vacation Bible School – it also will happen with or without Ecumenical participation. I would like us to look at the possibility of an offering of worship during the week for people that can't make it to worship on Sunday's because of work schedules or other drawbacks.

Sometimes I get ideas and someone more objective helps me apply the brakes to prevent overload. Feel free to be the breaker, I can take it.

Lastly, let me say this, PLEASE do not be afraid to call on me when you need me. Even though I am part-time and I know I live a distance away, I don't mind driving and am willing to make time for you in your time of need. I'm normally in the office on Thursdays from 11 am until 4pm. I have an answer machine at home and I will return your call as soon as humanly possible. Audit Committee Report

An audit of the church's General Fund from January 2018 – December 2018 was completed on January 6 th , 2020.

This audit found the following inconsistencies:

- 1. Week # 15 there was a discrepancy between the financial secretary's weekly report (\$1345) and the bank's general checking account statement (\$1346) but when adding the items listed on the report the total only came to \$895.00.
- 2. There was no financial secretary's weekly report for week #39 but \$352.00 was deposited according to the bank's statement to the church's general checking account corresponding to when the week #39 deposit would have been made.
- 3. The treasure's checkbook detail sheet listed a deduction for TWC/Spectrum twice in August 2018 but only one actual withdrawal was made according to the bank's general checking account statement.

In addition Brenda Brookins observed and assisted with the audit. She agreed to assume doing the audits for the church. The trustees will be contacting her to work out the details regarding the financial compensation and position requirements.
