Trustee Updates

Numerous instances have been brought to the attention of the trustees regarding autos driving through our parking lot in order to cut off going through the light in town. This has resulted in near-misses of patrons walking and also for cars attempting to pull out when someone drives around the chain barrier through our handicap parking signs. It has caused lawn damages as well. Three new "No Thru Traffic" signs were procured and installed in the parking lot. Two are fixed ground-mounts, one at each entrance and one portable sign is located in the middle near where we used to have a sugar maple tree and chain across with a "STOP" sign in the past.

The trustees and pastor met with Church Mutual for regular business review of our policy and inspection of facilities. No additional needs were recommended. However, we have initiated a simultaneous review of business and community; legal advice has been advised and has been procured following an auto fire in our parking lot July 1, 2022.

The roof over the sanctuary was cleaned and resealed in rusted areas where water has leaked on eaves. Protective materials have been applied to the front entrance vestibule roof. Work on the main sanctuary roof will begin with removal of limbs from the large oak overhanging the church. We have repaired and repainted other items requiring maintenance in the kitchen, bathroom and main sanctuary. Thanks to Cindy for extra cleaning in the downstairs storage room rafters so that pest control services can begin. Trustees will be in attendance for the first visit.

Bardoun Land Surveying provided more detailed maps of the church property boundaries. Bardoun also returned to install wooden survey stakes near the property corners on Fulton Street for our future reference. This builds upon and takes advantage of survey work by the fire department last year-at no cost to us.

Please remember and remind others using the facilities to put the chain up across the driveway before leaving.
