The Paston's Corner



Each man (and woman) should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. 2 Corinthians 9:7-8

Advent – a time of expectant waiting - not without impatience - for something we know already happened: the long desired birth of the Messiah, Jesus. We also wait for something that hasn't happened yet: the return of Jesus, as promised.

We don't talk a lot about His return. That is something unfamiliar because nothing like it has ever happened. So we concentrate on what we do know. Christmas and gift giving. We shop til we drop looking for the perfect gift for that someone special. Of course, there are those who are already done with the shopping and probably the wrapping too. But for most of us the challenge is alive and well.

All of that shopping and dropping seems a bit silly sometimes. Aren't we blessed that the Ultimate Gift Giver gave us the most precious gift ever? God gave us the gift of life. I have a sheet of paper that goes in great detail about the difference between a job and a ministry. Basically, it says if you feel you have to do it, it's a job; if you enjoy doing it, it's a ministry. God wants giving to be part of our ministry. He tells us to give what we can; whether it's a financial gift, a gift of our time or a gift of our talent. He doesn't want us to put ourselves in a position of hardship, just give what we can. He also wants us to give it with a cheerful heart.

As a family of believers, all we ask of each other is to give what you can with a cheerful heart and we will be thankful and able to bless "the least of these".
