

From the Reverend

Dear Friends.

On January 8th, I invited you to join me in intentional prayer for this church. We are seeking God's vision for the ministry of our church. It is more than a challenge that I issued. This is serious business. It is not a game. There will not be a prize given out for those who complete all 100 days. We are praying for God to reveal to us HIS vision for this church. It is frightening and exciting all at the same time.

What if God says something that we do not want to hear? It would not be the first time that ever happened. Remember Jonah? God told Jonah to take his word to the people of Nineveh, only Jonah didn't want to. Instead of listening to God, Jonah attempted to run off to Tarshish. That didn't accomplish anything, and Jonah ended up in the belly of a whale instead. Jonah eventually did end up in Nineveh, but got angry with God because he had compassion on some of the worst behaving people around.

Martin Luther once wrote, "To be a Christian without prayer, is no more possible than to be alive without breathing." Prayer is about communication with our creator. We are cultivating our relationship with the divine. Prayer is about God, not us. It includes us, but God is primary. God is not only found in the answers to our prayers, he is found in the prayers themselves. Be bold in your prayers; don't hold back. No one is going to scold you for saying what is on your heart. Merciful Creator, we desire as a church to take hold of the vision You have for us and pray that You would lead and guide us to take a collective step of faith in the direction that You would have us go. May we be sensitive to Your leading and guidance. Prevent us from seeking to implement our own inferior ideas instead of Your plans and purposes. Draw us closer to each other and to You, as we seek your face together in prayer. May we be united together in the unity of faith and prompted to carry out Your plans and purposes to Your greater glory. We pray that the church vision that emerges in our hearts will have been prompted by the Holy Spirit, for the edification of the saints to Your praise and glory. All these things we pray in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. AMEN


I look forward to praying for you and with you as we continue our journey through 100 days of prayer.
