

The Deacons had a successful year helping as many people as they could! They look forward to a new year!


Trustee Update

From the Pastor

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Jeremiah 29:11

This is my life verse. It's a fairly well known verse, I think. I see it on jewelry and plaques in many places.

As humans we set goals. Over time those goals can, and often do, change. As a small child I wanted to be a teacher. After graduating high school, I went to business school for a time.
