Detailed inquiries/surveys for both electrical and roof existing conditions were received from our new underwriter representative. The Trustees wrote detailed accounting of our maintenance and historical work, and provided photos of facilities as requested. We are waiting on response to the information provided. Presumably these requests for information are made in light of the severe winter our region

experienced in 2024-5.

The Trustees are pleased to present Koehler Jeroloman, a tenth grade student who has approached our church to partner in his pursuit of an Eagle Scout Service Project. Koehler is developing plans and project scheduling for continuing and finishing the good work of waterproofing our basement walls that began with the hard work of Ed Baxter and LeAnn. Thank you Ed and LeAnn for sanding and sealing work! In May, ArborTech Tree Service, Mark Holbrook and company, removed our Norway Spruce Tree overhanging both our garage and the neighbors. All of the cleanup work involved many trailer loads of limbs and wood taken to recycling. The entire cost of the tree removal was underwritten. Many thanks again to Ed and LeAnn for helping to cleanup. They are always willing and available to help. Keith Fox, Fox's Logging of Mallory, hauled the remaining six butt logs at no cost to Ted Aubin's portable sawmill on Morey Road in West Monroe. Surprisingly, no metal was found in the tree and this allowed the salvage of beautiful, clear spruce that was sawn into good lumber. Mike Murphy, our pest management specialist for the church, invested in the total cost of the sawing salvage and received the wood for use on his farm in Palermo. Thanks to each for their contributions to making our grounds and neighbors safer.

Also in May, a second old sump pump in our boiler room failed and required replacing. A new sump with vertical switch and new design check valve were installed. Unfortunately this, along with some minor window well leaks required numerous visits to address very sensitive water alarms through our service providers. Since August of 2024, the church now has two new sump pumps with better valves that should last for many years.

Following considerations by Council, the Trustees have approach a trusted Real Estate professional in assisting us to value the Parsonage for possible sale. Result of their advice will be brought back to Council for further thought.

Our kitchen stove manufacturer is no longer in business since 2016 but Garlan Commercial Kitchen Stoves are still sold and we have reached out to service providers in Tennessee and Canada for repair or parts of the right-side oven pilot light system. Until repairs are complete, use only the left oven and the gas supply must be turned off when not in use. We still continue to be plagued by water alarms with each large storm that passes as parking lot water makes its way into the older basement area. We are working to remedy this situation and you may see some piles of soil along the outside of the church foundation and driveway. Please be patient.

Thank you sincerely, to the folks who are volunteering to help with the lawn mowing.

There are many more items Trustees are working on. With your help and by the grace of our Lord, we will continue to meet these opportunities and challenges.
