Isaiah 59:1-2

Surely the arm of the Lord is not too short to save, nor his ear too dull to hear. But your iniquities have separated you from God; your sins have hidden his face from you; so that he will not hear.

This week we will begin our journey towards Easter also known as Resurrection Sunday. To get there we should be spending some time in reflection in the period we call Lent.

On Wednesday, the 26 th , at 11:00 am, we will be hosting a roundtable discussion with others from around the community to think about Lent and what it means.

Ashes will be available for those that wish to receive them. We tend to think of Ash Wednesday as a Roman Catholic observance but it has deep roots in our Christian beliefs.

In the Bible there were times when people would be so remorseful of their sins that they would sprinkle ashes on their head as a sign of sorrow and repentance. It's often hard for us to recognize our own sin. We like to think we are a good person and we would never commit sin. Sin is far more complicated than we care to admit.

Lent is also a good time to build and repair our relationships with each other but more importantly, with God. Fasting is one way to spend time focused on God and your relationship to Him. Jesus fasted in the desert after his baptism. As we strive to be more like Jesus we should each consider fasting. Of course, fasting isn't recommended for many health conditions but let me challenge you to give up something for Lent.


