

HEALTH TIPS!



New Acolytes



Junior Church Notes



During the month of February, the children have been looking in-depth into the Bible verse in Galatians 5:22-23 'But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."

For some background on this verse, I referred to the commentary In Life applications Study Bible and it read; "The Fruit of the Spirit is the spontaneous work of the Holy Spirit in us." If we want the fruit of the spirit to grow in us, we must join our lives to his (see John 15:4-5). We must know him, love him. Remember him and imitate him.
