AB Women Update

Fundraising for Randi

This fundraising adventure will benefit Randi Driesen's upcoming Mission to the Dominican Republic! This is Randi's second Mission trip there! Randi is part of the Medical Team that will leave January 8th and return the 18th.

"I will be flying into Santo Domingo the capital of Dominican Republic. From there we take an old school bus to the village of Las Colinas, near the city of San Pedro. We will be staying there in the compound. The construction team will be helping to build a new medical clinic in Las Colinas! Every day the medical staff will be going out to the "bateys" which are small villages of Haitian sugar cane workers. We will see children, men, women of all ages. Each nurse will have an interpreter, and we will prescribe medicine. There will be 2 doctors with us, when we have questions, and a pharmacist. We have someone handing out glasses if we see this is an issue. We start the day at the bateys between 9 and 10 am, break for lunch, then continue, the day generally ends around 3-4 pm. When we get back to the compound (the bus takes us back and forth), we have the rest of the day to help get the health kits made up and also help the pharmacist get her medications ready. Last year we saw 1200 people in 7 days! Crazy right??!! We can go to church every morning at 6 am if we want, Tues and Thurs evening is church, And Sunday morning and Sun evening is church. When I say there is so much happiness and singing and praising God in the church. I would not be exaggerating! The two Sunday afternoons we went to the beach. We went to a baseball game one evening. (baseball is the DR's big sport). We had time on a Sat afternoon to go sightseeing, and we visited the church and hospital this same group help build in the 80s and 90s. You can tell I loved this place, and so look forward to going again!"

The earliest recorded minutes for the ladies auxiliary is 1908, with mentions of the Thimble Party. They made aprons, tore rags, and made rugs, followed by business meetings 1909 - 10, noted as auxiliary meetings.

Liquid hand soap refill for bathrooms.


False Beliefs
