

The Passion of Christ is Rated R






The "R" rating is to show that Jesus was RESPONSIBLE for giving you REST. As a RESULT of his death. Jesus RETIRED your debt.

From The Reverend

I cannot believe we are already changing the calendar to October, fall has arrived, and the holidays will be upon us before we know it. I wanted to use this opportunity to update everyone on what is going on in our church, ways you can get involved, and some future events.

In September, we began a Thursday evening Bible Study that begins at 6:30pm. We are currently discussing "Celebrating God." We have a great group of participants, and would welcome anyone who like to join us.

I love music, and music is vital to our worship services. I am looking for people who are musically gifted and would like to share during worship. It can be vocal or instrumental. If you are interested in sharing, please let me know. I think it would be a wonderful addition to our service.

I have a friend who is a missionary to the Lakota tribe at Wounded Knee, in South Dakota. The Lakota have come a very long way. They allowed a church to be built on the reservation where my friend, Emily Clark, serves as Associate Pastor. Emily has lived on the reservation for the last 3 years. The Lakota are dealing with extreme poverty, lack of proper medical care, lack of education, and a high teen pregnancy and suicide rate. Through a great deal of prayer and hard work, the Women, Infant, Children's Program (WIC) is now going to be available on the reservation. This is a tremendous blessing for them. WIC's first request was for knitted or crocheted baby blankets. If you would like to donate one you have made, or one that is gently used, I would be happy to ship them to South Dakota.

Our Executive Minister for the American Baptist Churches of New York State, Rev. Dr. Jim Kelsey, will be with us for worship on October 30th. I have asked Rev. Kelsey to come out to discuss with us some of the issues facing the church today. My request has been for him to help us find a better way to facilitate communication, as well as the challenges every church faces with both an aging congregation and an aging building. We all know that people just are not going to church like they once did, and Dr. Kelsey will offer help with strategies that will allow us to continue the ministries of this church. You will have an opportunity to speak confidentially with him if you would like to. We would like to have a luncheon after church to welcome him. Please keep October 30th open on your calendar.

Finally, I am pleased to announce that I have been nominated for the Nehemiah Leadership program, twice. I was nominated by Dr. Kelsey and Rev. Jerrod Hugenot, who serves as our Associate Execute Minister for New York State. According to the program packet, "The purpose of the Nehemiah Leadership Network is to provide specialized training, guidance and support for persons identified as having high potential for leading congregations to become renewed and transformed and who feel called by God to this form of ministry." I will work with my colleagues and mentors over the next three years to lead this congregation through transformation. The theme of my next three years in ministry is called, "Come, let us rebuild." I am excited to see what God will bring to this place over the next three years. I am grateful that the executive board is willing to support me in this adventure, and I would appreciate your prayers as I begin the program in February.

Keep your eyes and hearts open, for we have had visitors in our midst lately. Please greet them and make them feel welcome. If you have been missing someone who has not been around for a while, reach out to them, let them know they are loved and welcome to come back anytime.
