To Your Health



"Don't let the bed bugs bite." With all the news about the outbreak of this ancient pest, we might wonder what can we do.

The first thing is to try to avoid staying in motels / hotels that have infestations. Although that's easier said than done, there are two web sites that can be helpful. The first is **bedbugregistry.com** which allows people to both report bedbugs and to see where bedbugs have already been reported. Clicking on an interactive map will help you find out what you want to know. Or don't want to know.

The second is a site that coaches us how to inspect a hotel room and what to look for. www.ca.uky.edu/entomology/entfacts/ef636.asp was written by an entomology professor at the University of Kentucky who has had actual experiences with bed bugs.

If you think you have them, a cheap yet effective way of trapping them is documented at sciencenews.org/view/generic/id/51188/title/Do-it-yourself_bed-bug_detector. Basically, put about 2 ½ pounds of dry ice pellets in an insulated, 1/3 gallon jug (like the kind found at camping or sports stores) and don't quite close the lid. Place the container in a plastic cat food dish dusted with talcum powder and tape a piece of paper to the outside of the dish to act as a ramp.

This contraption is just as effective, or better than, two brands of equipment used by professionals. The best part is all the parts, including the dry ice, cost about \$15.

BOAND THAINING WONKSHOP

ABC/NYS will conduct it's popular **Board Training Workshop** on **February 12**th at their Whitesboro Conference Center. It may seem like a long way off, but time will go by very quickly.

The seminars this year will cover Christian Ed, Trustees, Deacons, Pastoral Relations, Mission & Stewardship, and One Board System. The material presented has been very helpful to many ABC church members in our Region, including folks from our own church. Details are posted on our bulletin board.
