Stressful Social interactions can bring with them biological risks. "Competing in vain for the attention of someone special or fretting over a mid-term exam may not be healthy." Such are the conclusions of researchers at the UCLA School of Medicine who were found that young, healthy college students who had endured those types of stresses had high concentrations of two inflammation-causing proteins circulating in their blood stream.

A revved-up inflammation system when there's no infection to fight can has been linked to an increased risk of heart disease, high blood pressure, cancer, and depression.
