USED CELL PHOMES

We have had a collection box in Fellowship Hall for used inkjet printer cartridges for several years. We then ship them to a company that reprocesses them so they can be reused. Although it doesn't generate a lot of money for us, it does bring in enough to help pay for new printer cartridges. And it keeps the old ones out of the landfill.

Now, we've begun collecting used cell phones. The collection box in Fellowship Hall looks very similar to the ink cartridge box. But when you look closely, you'll see that it is clearly marked for used cell phones. So, if you've been wondering what to do with those old phones you shoved in your dresser drawer, just bring them on in.

GoodSearch

Instead of using whatever default search engine your web browser provides, consider using **GoodSearch**. Why? Each time you do a search using GoodSearch, \$.01 will be donated to your favorite charity or non-profit. Just go to **www.GoodSearch.com** and in the section on the top right that says "My Impact", enter First Baptist Church of Central Square and click the "Validate" button.

If you shop on-line, consider visiting one of the more than 2,500 GoodShop merchants that can be found on the GoodSearch site. Why? Up to 8% of the purchase price will be donated to – us. And if you register your credit card with GoodDining, guess what happens when you dine at one of the participating restaurants? A portion will be directed to our church.
